The winter season is upon us! As we prepare to usher in the New Year, it is important to reflect on all that our group accomplished this past year. During 2024, our group:

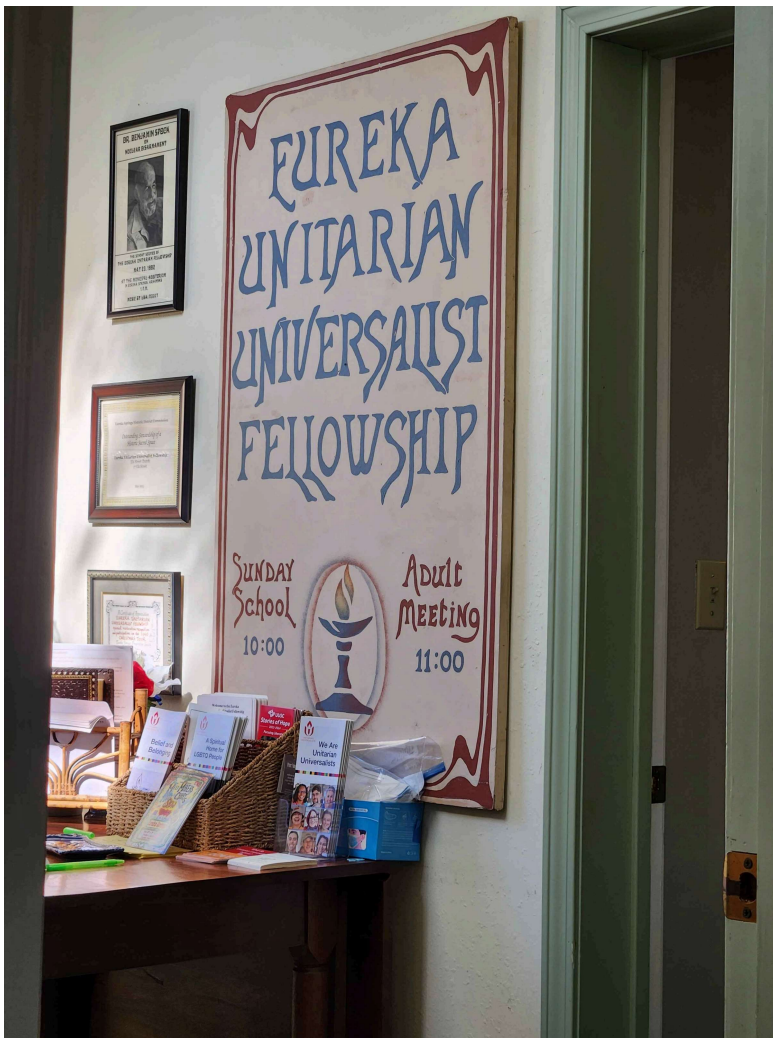
- Volunteered at the NWA Women's Shelter and Elizabeth Richardson Center in Rogers, AR.
- Picked up trash along a one-mile stretch of AR-12 as part of Arkansas Adopt-A-Highway in April and October.
- Held monthly tabling events at the Bentonville & Fayetteville Farmers Markets from April through October.
- Sponsored a 30 day billboard run during the month of April.
- Participated in Pride Events in Fort Smith and Fayetteville
- Hosted a Summer Speaker series, which included Matthew D. Taylor (Protest Scholar at the Institute for Islamic, Christian & Jewish Studies), Christopher Line (Staff Attorney with FFRF) and Seth Andrews (Author, Activist and host of the Thinking Atheist).
- Held our 3rd Annual Constitution Day Event on September 17th.
- Represented our chapter at the 47th Annual FFRF National Convention in Denver, CO.
- Created an official Ozarks Chapter of FFRF logo and had t-shirts made.
- Spoke at the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship in Eureka Springs, AR.
- For the second year, erected a secular "Bill of Rights Nativity Display" at the state capitol building in Little Rock, AR

The Ozarks Chapter of FFRF stayed active this fall. Our Adopt a Highway cleanup event was well attended, with our group cleaning up over 20 bags of garbage! We followed up a week later meeting with engaged an audience at Universalist Unitarian Fellowship in Eureka Springs. Chapter leader Chris Sweeny spoke to the Fellowship about the perils of

Christian Nationalism, and how the influential-but-little-known group FFRF.org plays an outsized role in protecting separation between church & state. After the presentation, the combined UU and FFRF members met at GotAHold Brewery to relax and socialize on a balmy November afternoon. In December, several of our members visited the Capitol Building in Little Rock, AR, where, in combination with the **Arkansas Society of Freethinkers**, we erected a secular "Bill of Rights Nativity" display. We closed out the year by welcoming the Winter Solstice with TrailMix NWA while also hosting a small Festivus Celebration.

In a first for the Ozarks Chapter of FFRF, our organization was also able to financially support non-profits in our community. By way of the FFRF.org Charitable Grant, we are able to contribute to the following:

- **TrailMix NWA** - whose mission is to empower individuals to make a positive impact in NWA by providing a secular community, promoting environmental stewardship, and facilitating values-based education. We contributed \$500 to their cause.
